



Provider Access Statement

This statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the school for the purposes of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

STUDENT ENTITLEMENTS

Students in Years 7-11 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through careers sessions, options evening, assemblies, group discussions and taster events.
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

AVAILABILITY OF PREMISES AND FACILITIES

The school will make the main hall, classrooms, library or meeting room available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available audio-visual and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Assistant Headteacher responsible for careers.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature with the Careers Lead, with a copies available in the library. The library is available to all students at lunch and break times.
